

PUBLIC NOTICE OF TELEPHONIC PUBLIC COMMENT PROCEEDING
ON ALLIANT GAS, LLC RATE CASE AND FINANCING CASE.
(DOCKET NOS. G-20889A-19-0200 AND G-20889A-19-0252)

Summary

On August 22, 2019, Alliant Gas, LLC (“Alliant Gas” or “Company”) filed an Application with the Arizona Corporation Commission (“Commission”), in Docket No. 20889A-19-0200, for a determination of the fair value of its utility plants and property and for increases in its rates and charges for utility service based thereon (“Rate Case”).

On October 16, 2019, in Docket No. G-20889A-19-0252, the Company filed an Application for authority to incur up to \$7,000,000 in new long-term debt financing (“Financing Case”).

The Rate Case and Financing Case have been consolidated for the Commission’s consideration in this matter. Both applications are currently being reviewed by the Commission’s Utilities Division, which has not yet made any recommendations.

THE COMMISSION IS NOT BOUND BY THE PROPOSALS OF ALLIANT GAS, STAFF, OR ANY INTERVENORS. THE COMMISSION WILL DETERMINE THE APPROPRIATE RELIEF TO BE GRANTED IN RESPONSE TO ALLIANT GAS’S APPLICATIONS BASED ON THE EVIDENCE PRESENTED IN THIS MATTER. THE RATES AND CHARGES APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION MAY BE HIGHER, LOWER, OR DIFFERENT THAN THE RATES AND CHARGES PROPOSED BY ALLIANT GAS.

Public Comment Opportunities

The Commission has scheduled a Public Comment Proceeding for this matter to be held on June 22, 2020, at 10:00 a.m. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the **Public Comment Proceeding will be conducted telephonically, and members of the public will not be admitted into the Commission's building for the Public Comment Proceeding.**

To provide telephonic public comment, speakers must call **1 (888) 450-5996** and enter passcode **457395#**.

The Commission encourages commenters to **use landline telephones** to call into the Telephonic Public Comment Proceeding, as mobile telephones do not consistently provide adequate audio quality to permit the verbatim transcription of telephonic speech.

The Commission may impose a **three-minute time limit per speaker**, to ensure that everyone who desires to speak has an opportunity to do so. That time limit may be extended by the presiding Administrative Law Judge.
